LANGUAGE ARTS

We have been really focused on finishing the writing narrative prompt, which took two of our writing periods. We will be continuing our typical writing next week. We kept working on Word Study as well this week. Students created their own word lists, which they will use next week to study for their spelling tests. They sorted their words and found new words to add to the lists! In reading, we have been working on how to take information from different mediums to learn about our nation, our government, and the upcoming election. We read a book about becoming President, and students had to infer and quote information from the text to identify five characteristics of a good President, three advantages of being President and three disadvantages of being President.

MATH

Math has been rocking this week! We reviewed our math check in quiz on comparing last week and students were able to retake it. We also continued to learn how to add and subtract like fractions in word problems using the Read, Draw, Write concept. Students then learned how to find equivalent fractions using visual models so that they could

add unlike fractions. We finished the week with a game of Jeopardy and then students started to take the Mid-Module assessment.

SCIENCE/SOCIAL STUDIES

What a great week for Social Studies! We are having a mock election next week here at the school, so we are learning all about our country's government. We learned about the President, what requirements you need to have to become President, what the three branches of government are and why we have them, and more.
