This week, a student really stood out to me. She constantly helped around the classroom, holding the math bins so they would not fall down, participating, using a kind tone of voice, helping pick up chairs when it was not her job, etc. She did all of this without looking for recognition. This child simply warmed my heart each day, and I want her to know that her actions have not gone unnoticed.

MATH

In math this week, we started to learn about fractions! For many students, fractions are a new concept. We are learning how to decompose a whole (which was split into sixths) into a number bond, a number equation, and an equation using parentheses. We are going to learn about how multiplication can work with

fractions next week. Students also took the Math Common Formative Assessment for unit 1, we learned how to play with dice and cards using guided discovery, and we also learned where our math bins are.

SCIENCE/SOCIAL STUDIES

In Social studies this week, we really worked on building our shared agreements (be safe, whole body listening, be appropriate, be positive, work as a team), and we started to talk about classroom consequences. We are learning more about one another each day by playing games such as "Hands Up!" "Elves, Wizards, Giants," participating in closing circle, and sharing each morning.
